What are the HPCA Landscape Committee members duties?

The HPCA Landscape Committee has the responsibility to work with the landscape company and the Board to keep our community beautiful.

Brightview Landscaping has now been with us for one year. During that time we also had a new landscape committee and new Board that were still learning about the complexity of the property that HPCA owns. This is a very large property. The areas that Brightview is responsible to care for are the Edgewater Community, all of the common areas which consist of 41st Ave, Vashon Blvd from 41st all the way to Columbia Blvd, along the trail and new areas that have been added as Century Builders leaves the community are Eagles Bluff and Woodlands Cove. Brightview also maintains the trail to no where along Marvin Road (but not the trees) and the entire trail down to the beach.

Brightview has a crew of 4 designated landscapers for our entire community. This crew only cares for our property and they take great pride in their work. Now that the areas they will be maintaining are better defined they will be able to maintain a better schedule. They will begin pruning the shrubs in January. This will be a deep pruning but they state that when it grows out it will be healthier and have a more natural look. We are also looking to freshen up the yards removing overgrown plants as they prune and clean up. The rhododendrons and azaleas will not be trimmed until after they have bloomed out in March or April.

The landscapers will be trimming tree branches that are touching houses, but they only trim up to 12 feet.
